### School of Law

One hundred years ago a prospectus was published. Its publishers were Joseph Henry Lumpkin, William H. Hull and Thomas R. R. Cobb, and it announced the intent of establishing a "Law School in connection with the University of Georgia." The School, the prospectus maintained, would be a blessing to the legal profession and the community, the current custom of preparing for the Bar by studying in the office of some lawyer being considered inadequate. "Believing that such a school is demanded," the prospectus continued, "we shall devote our energies to the effort, which we will not abandon lightly. We expect success only by descriving it. If we deserve it, we shall not fear obtaining it." As the Law School enters upon another Century, students and faculty pledge their best efforts toward carrying on the work begun by the founders.
