MEMORANDUM

Re: Registration for Spring, 2006

Date: November 11, 2005

As you begin the point allocation process, I write to provide some information about the schedule. The schedule being used for point allocation is the one dated November 11, 2005. There have been a number of changes since the original schedule was posted last spring, most of them involving the addition of courses. There have been some time changes and a small number of deleted courses. Check this schedule carefully.

Adjunct Professors----You will note that some spring courses will be taught by instructors who are not members of the tenure-track faculty. Brief biographical information about these instructors is available on the Law School's web site.

Pre-requisites—Certain courses have pre-requisites. Please attend to them. Students who do not satisfy the pre-requisite requirements will **not** be permitted to enroll, unless there has been a waiver by the instructor.

Course Descriptions—These are available on the Law School's web site on the Student Resources page within the Student Handbook. Courses which do not appear there are as follows:

Building and Maintaining a Law Practice—(1 credit)—Mr. Finley---This minicourse will cover the basics of establishing, building and maintaining a law firm from inception to growth. Topics range from marketing tactics, to establishing a client base, to methods of charging clients and dealing with difficult clients, to methods of networking, to hiring and management of employees. This mini-course will be limited to 3rd year students and will be graded on a pass/fail basis.

European Union Competition Law----(1 credit)---Mr. Cardon----The course will focus on the application of the provisions of Art. 81 (dealing with cartels) and of Art. 82 (dealing with abuse of dominant position) of the European Community Treaty and certain aspects of EC Merger Law. Specific topics which will be considered include: extraterritorial application of competition law, effects doctrine, international cartels, leniency policy, relevant market concept, champion theory, bilateral agreements on the application of competition law (and the two generations of cooperation agreements) and international competition law. Contrasts with American antitrust law will be drawn, focusing on competition cases involving international or transnational disputes, such as the *Vitamins Cartel* case, the European *Microsoft* case, the *Boeing/Mc Donnell Douglas* merger, the *GE/Honeywell* merger case...

<u>Prerequisites</u>: some knowledge of Antitrust law, Public International law, International Trade law and EU law, or at least some of these areas, would be useful.

International Law Colloquium—(2 credits)—Professors Bodansky & Spiro—This course will meet for seven two-hour sessions during the semester. It will consist of presentations of substantial works-in-progress on a variety of international law topics by prominent scholars from other law schools. In addition to reading the manuscripts and actively participating in classroom discussion of the work with the presenters, students will be expected to write 3-4 page reaction papers on each of the colloquium papers. Open to a maximum of 12 students.

Prerequisite: International Law I

Medical Malpractice----(1 credit)—Mr. Cook and Mr. Booth-- A nuts and bolts approach to medical malpractice law and litigation in Georgia. Taught by practicing attorneys, plaintiff and defense perspectives are offered. While the focus is on substantive law, the procedural aspects of such cases are also covered.

Visual Arts and the Law—(2 credits)----**Ms. Kincheloe**—I have not been able to obtain a course description from Ms. Kincheloe at this point.

Course Not Yet On the Schedule

I have made tentative arrangements with Mr. Steve Schaetzel of the Atlanta Bar to teach a minicourse on patent litigation. This one-credit course will focus on proving infringement under the doctrines of literal infringement and of equivalents, Markman hearings, and non-infringement defenses (prosecution history estoppel, practicing the prior art). The course, however, does not appear on the schedule because we have not been able to finalize the dates and times. The basic Patent Law course will be a pre-requisite or corequisite.

Before point allocation begins tomorrow, I wanted to provide some clarifying and updating information to assist you in the process:

New Course----Professor Kim Van der Borght of the University of Hull in England will be offering a 1-credit minicourse from February 20 through March 9. The course description follows:

Dispute Settlement in the WTO----(1 credit)—Mr. Van der Borght—Course will provide an in-depth understanding of the World Trade Organization's dispute settlement system, which has been described as the crown jewel of the world's trading system. While its compulsory jurisdiction and enforcement mechanism make it attractive, many reform proposals have been offered, ranging from minor technical improvements to major overhauls of the system. Some proposals are based on pragmatic concerns, while other are driven by views on global governance. The course will review the system's development, its current practice and procedure and reform proposals. Its role in developing a WTO jurisprudence will be reviewed as well as its relationship to other international dispute settlement mechanisms.

Course Descriptions

The following course descriptions do not appear in the online Student Handbook or in my prior memorandum.

International Law Seminar----Professor Bodansky---Advanced reading seminar on international law. Reading and discussion with focus on recent works on the role (and limits) of international law, focusing in particular on the Iraq war and terrorism. Students will write a 20-25 page research paper on a topic of their choice and present their paper to the seminar.

Prerequisite: International Law I or Permission of Instructor

Visual Arts and the Law----Ms. Moore (formerly Kincheloe)—This course will address significant legal issues in the visual arts world, including but not limited to, controversial art and censorship, moral rights, the intersection of the First Amendment and intellectual property laws, lost and stolen art, the looting of cultural antiquities, the artist-gallery partnership, auction houses, agents museums and art dealers, the consignment of art and recent developments with respect to public funding of the arts. Students will analyze statutes, case law and current events related to the above, in addition to having the opportunity to hear guest speakers such as Karen Finley of the "NEA Four", Dred Scott who created the seminal work, "What is the Proper Way to Display a Flag?" and a prominent attorney from Sotheby's auction house.

Minicourse Dates

Building and Maintaining a Law Practice will begin on February 15th, rather than the originally announced starting date of January 19. The course will conclude on March 29th, as originally announced.

Time Switch

European Union Law course will be offered on Thursday from 12:30 p.m. to 2:20 p.m., rather than the originally scheduled Tuesday slot.

Typographical Error on Schedule

Conflict of Laws is the correct name of the course being taught by Professor Brown in the spring semester. It is a 3-credit course and will meet from 3:30 to 4:45 p.m. on Tuesdays and Thursdays. The original schedule incorrectly had an additional session on Friday.

Corrections to Online Handbook Listings

Business Crimes and **International Intellectual Property** are both three-credit courses beginning this spring semester. The online handbook listings indicating these as two-credit offerings has been corrected.
