AIM OF THE SEMINAR

The principal aim of the Brussels Seminar is to provide a group of interested American law students with intensive exposure to the law and institutions of the European Economic Community. In addition, they will be given an opportunity to explore and discuss the influence on the United States of the economic, social and legal integration being achieved in the Common Market.

This will be the seventh session of the Brussels Seminar. All of the sessions have been organized with the support of Professor Dean Rusk, Samuel H. Sibley Professor of International Law at the University of Georgia, School of Law.

REQUIREMENTS AND PROCEDURES

The Brussels Seminar will take place from 9 to 20 July, 1979.

Twenty-five qualified student participants will be selected from among United States law students who have completed at least two years of law training: students who have finished one year of law training can be admitted on the basis of previous work in areas of relevance to EEC law. Preference will be given to students who will attend the second period of the Hague Academy of International Law (Public International Law) upon completion of the Brussels Seminar.
