University of Georgia School of Law Fall Semester 2006 Grade Distribution

The majority of University of Georgia School of Law students are not ranked in individual order. Only those members of a class whose cumulative grade point averages are in the top ten percent or have a cumulative grade point average greater than 3.5 are ranked in individual order.

The following information is provided to assist students and prospective employers in determining the general range of a particular student's grade point average. This chart represents the distribution of cumulative grade point averages at the end of the 2005-2006 Academic Year.
