I, Hanns SCHADE, after having been warned that I will be liable for punishment for making a false statement, state herewith under oath, of my own free will and without coercion; the following:

1. That I, Hanns Schade, am employed as a Research Analyst by the Office of the Chief of Counsel for War Crimes, Nurnberg, Germany and have been so employed in such capacity since July 1947.
2. That on 16th December 1947, I prepared and executed an affidavit which bears identification as Document No. NIK- 13 173.
3. That in order to support and to set forth in greater exactitude the arithmetical conclusions stated in the afore-mentioned affidavit (Document No. NIK- 13 173) the following additional statements should be included therein:

- (a) To the list of documents described in paragraph 4 of the aforementioned affidavit should be added:  
" NIK- 7259, affidavit of Otto Hofmann, dated 12 June 1947, referring to the employment of foreign workers, prisoners of war and concentration camp inmates at Norddeutsche Huette, Bremen."
- (b) To the statement made in paragraph 3 of the afore-mentioned affidavit, concerning  
" 69,898 total number of foreign civilian workers," should be added the following additional remark."
