

Bondurant and Klein receive Distinguished Service Scroll Awards



Georgia Law alumni Emmet J. Bondurant II (LL.B.'60) and Kenneth "Ken" Klein (J.D.'76) have been named the 2009 recipients of the Law School Association's Distinguished Service Scroll Award.

This is the LSA's highest honor and is given annually to individuals whose dedication and service to the legal profession and the law school deserve special recognition.

The awards were presented during the school's annual alumni breakfast held in conjunction with the State Bar of Georgia Annual Meeting in June.



Emmet Bondurant

Bondurant has been a trial lawyer for more than 45 years and is a partner at Bondurant, Mixson & Elmore. Although he has specialized in antitrust law, he has also represented both plaintiffs and defendants in a wide variety of other areas including patent, securities, trade secret, professional malpractice and complex corporate disputes in both federal and state trial and appellate courts.

A strong supporter of the *Georgia Law Review* and the D. Meade Feild Scholarship, Bondurant has also served as chair of the school's Board of Visitors and as a member of the LSAC.

He earned his J.D. *magna cum laude* and his A.B. *cum laude* from UGA. Prior to attending Harvard University for his LL.M., Bondurant served as a judicial clerk for the late Judge Clement F. Haynsworth Jr. of the U.S. Court of Appeals for the 4th Circuit.

Klein is a partner at Mayer Brown and is a practice leader for the firm's Tax Transactions and Planning Department. His areas of focus include international taxation, tax planning, tax transactions, tax controversies and public policy. He has also represented domestic and international clients in numerous industries.

Additionally, Klein has served on the law school's BOV. He has also been a generous contributor to the Dean Rusk Center and the Brussels study abroad program and was instrumental in the creation of the Gabriel M. Wilner Scholarship Fund.

He earned his B.A. *magna cum laude* from the University of Delaware and his J.D. *cum laude* from UGA, where he served as articles editor of the *Georgia Journal of International & Comparative Law*. He later earned his M.L.T. (Master of Laws in Taxation) from Georgetown University.
