One hundred years ago a prospectus was published. Its publishers were Joseph Henry Lumpkin, William H. Hull and Thomas R. R. Cobb, and it announced the intent of establishing a "Law School in connection with the University of Georgia." "Believing that such a school is demanded," the prospectus continued, "we shall devote our energies to the effort, which we will not abandon lightly. We expect success only by deserving it.
