The fall semester schedule dated August 13 is the one which shall be used during the schedule adjustment period which begins on August 15. While there have been some room changes necessitated by the delay in the summer's building renovations, there have been relatively few changes in the courses offered. These few changes are as followed:

Course Removed from Schedule: Professor Huszagh's Business Problems course will not be offered in the fall. It has, however, been added to the schedule for Spring Semester, 2003.

Course Added to the Schedule: Professor Mary Radford of the Georgia State College of Law in Atlanta will offer a 3-credit course in Estate and Gift Tax (Tuesday/ Thursday, 8:05-9:20 a.m., Room H). Professor Radford, who has taught here before as a visitor, is a graduate of the Emory Law School. She practiced law in Atlanta before joining the GSU faculty in 1984. In addition to having taught as a visitor here, she has been a visiting professor at Emory and a Judicial Fellow at the United States Supreme Court.

Minicourse Calendar Change: The minicourse in International Law & Preservation of Cultural Heritage will run from September 23-October 4, rather than the dates previously announced.

Minicourses Added to the Schedule (these minicourses are in addition to those previously announced in my [April memorandum](#) at the beginning of the registration process.):

(1) Professor Dan Bodansky, who will be joining the faculty this fall as the Woodruff Professor of International Law, will teach a one-credit course on Law, Science & Policy. The course is designed to provide an interdisciplinary perspective on climate change, perhaps the greatest environmental challenge of our times. It will examine the broad array of scientific, political, economic and legal issues raised by climate change, including: What is known scientifically? To the extent the science is uncertain, what is the appropriate policy response? What are the economic implications of different possible policies? How can we organize international cooperation to address climate change? What role can law play? What are the strengths and weaknesses of the Kyoto Protocol from a scientific, economic, political and legal perspective? Professor Bodansky is a Yale Law graduate who was an attorney for the Department of State for four years before joining the faculty of the University of Washington Law School in 1989.

This course will meet from 9:30 to 11:20 a.m. (Room I) beginning on October 7 and concluding on November 25.

(2) Professor Ellen Podgor, of the Georgia State law faculty, will teach a one-credit course on International Criminal Law. This course is a survey of basic principles of jurisdiction in international criminal law. It will examine several specific applications (e.g., business crimes, money laundering, terrorism), procedural issues (e.g., immunities from jurisdiction, obtaining evidence from abroad, extradition), and the advantages and disadvantages of the International Criminal Court. The course will use the following text: Wise & Podgor, International Criminal Law: Cases & Materials (Lexis 2000), 2002 Supplement (available free on-line). Professor Podgor, who visited here two years ago, is a graduate of University of Indiana-Indianapolis Law School and earned her LL.M. at Temple Law School. She is a former prosecutor and criminal defense attorney and has served for 11 years on the GSU faculty. Last spring she was the visiting Stone Professor at the University of Alabama Law School.

(3) Ms. Lee Ann Bambach will offer a one-credit course in Legal Systems in the Middle East. This course will give a comparative overview of selected legal systems in the Middle East, focusing primarily on the Israeli, Palestinian, Egyptian, and Saudi Arabian systems. It will examine the historical and religious foundations of these systems, as well as their development over the last century, the current state of the law and possible future developments. A 1997 graduate of the Law School, Ms. Bambach studied Judaism and Islam at the Hebrew University of Jerusalem and at Harvard University, where she received her M.T.S. She speaks Hebrew and Arabic and is the author of "Women at the Wall: Finding a Place for Women in Judaism," published in Church Divinity. After serving as Editor in Chief of the Georgia Law Review, she clerked for the Honorable Sam J. Ervin, III on the United States Court of Appeals for the Fourth Circuit and worked as an associate at the D.C. office of Latham & Watkins. She currently serves as a board member for the Iraqi Free Officers Movement

(4) Mr. Charles Smitherman, with the assistance of Associate Dean Gabriel Wilner, will teach a one-credit course in International Legal Research. This course, which is especially useful to those who will be working on the Georgia Journal of International and Comparative Law, will focus on techniques of doing research in foreign materials. Mr. Smitherman is a 2002 graduate of the Law School who served as Editor-in-Chief of the Georgia Journal during the 2001-2 academic year.

This course will be taught on Tuesdays and Thursdays (4:30-6:20 p.m.) in Room G from August 27 through September 17.
