





  - 50-140 characters
- Keyword optimized
- Save the funny stuff






# Metadata Abstract

- Always include
- Focused, clearly written abstracts
  - 3-4 keyword phrases maximum
  - 150-200 words
- Standardize spelling of author & affiliation






