Curriculum

Faculty growth has not kept pace with that of the student body. For 1972-73, there was no change in the number of faculty members over the previous year. Consequently, the student-faculty ratio climbed from 17:1 in 1968 to 30:1 in 1972. This is double the 15:1 ratio considered appropriate by leading legal scholars. This critical situation can only be remedied by adding six new faculty positions or by considerably reducing the size of the entering class.

The larger enrollment in the second and third year classes, produced by successive large entering classes and a lowered attrition rate, necessitated increasing the number of elective courses whenever possible. This program could be accomplished only by reducing the number of seminar offerings. To compensate in part for this reduction of seminars, a number of faculty members accepted students for individual tutorial research.

An effort was made to continue the policy of triple sectionalization in the first-year courses. In addition, it was possible to offer two of the basic second-year courses in three sections to reduce the class size.

The decision of the faculty to make all work after the first year of law school elective, with the exception of the course in the Legal Profession, has continued to work well. Most students have elected to take all the formerly required second-year curriculum offerings. Nevertheless, a number of students with well-defined career goals have been able to take a greater concentration of courses of particular interest and importance to them.
