



These instructions are for the law school's official repository Digital Commons. This is not related to Scholastica or any other external journal websites.

A PDF version of these instructions that includes screen captures is attached to the bottom of this page. If you prefer following print instructions, please use that resource. When your journal has all items (TOC pdf. Articles/Notes pdf files) ready for the publication of a new issue, go to your law journal's appropriate "Submit Article" link below to begin:

- Georgia Criminal Law Review Submission Form
- . Georgia Law Review Submission Form
- · Georgia Journal of International & Comparative Law Submission Form
- · Journal of Intellectual Property Law Submission Form

For each document from a journal issue, you will need the following information (use the TOC pdf to copy + paste):

- author name
- . title (not in all caps)
- publication date
- · type (toc. article, note, etc.)
- . file of the document itself

When you are ready to begin uploading:

- Login; each journal should have an email address & password do not use your individual student email.
- 2. Read Submission Instructions, and click "Continue"
- 3. Read Submissions Agreement, and click "Continue"
- 4. Fill out the About You Form with your own email address and institution (this step lefs librarians on the backend know who is submitting the article so we can verify you are one of the journal editors and not a random public user)
- 5. Fill out the Edit Authors Form
 - . DELETE YOURSELF be sure to remove yourself as an "Author"
 - ADD AUTHOR(S) click the "Add Author" button: you do not have to locate and enter the author's email address.
 - . EDIT AUTHOR(S) if you need to edit the name or institution of an author, click "Edit Author" button
- 6. Fill out Submission Form, and click "Submit"
 - DOUBLE CHECK AUTHOR INFORMATION if this is incorrect, click the browser back button to make changes.
 - PASTE ARTICLE TITLE we recommend copying and pasting a formatted title (no caps) from the TOC pdf
 - SHORT TITLE optional, leave this blank is most cases.
 - KEYWORDS copy and paste obvious keywords from the title; no more than 3 words separated by commas
 - PUBLICATION DATE copy and paste this from the header of the TOC pdf

Sharing Issues with Database Providers

These instructions are for sharing outbound public links and XML with external database providers after your journal's issue has been published online.

The law school's official repository Digital Commons auto-generates the syntax for all issue and article metadata each time new issues are published.

The database providers still need to be notified and given properly formatted links to capture your latest publication.

- When your journal has a complete newly uploaded issue published and publicly available in Digital Commons, it will display on the front homepage of your journal's site:
 - . Georgia Criminal Law Review site
 - Georgia Journal of International & Comparative Law site
 - . Georgia Law Review site
 - . Journal of Intellectual Property Law site

II. If you uploaded an entire issue but it is not displaying, be sure you have reached out to your journal's librarian liaison. They need to accept all uploads, as well as create and assign Volume and Issue Numbers in order to publish for you. Please allow 48 hours or more for them to take those back-end steps. 

- D. Test the updated, formatted URL by clicking ENTER to load the XML. If it loads and looks like the example below (and says near the top left "This XML file..." you have done this step correctly. You can also ctrl+F or Apple+F to search and find a random article or note title from the issue you published to ensure it is pulling the latest issue.





Metadata Services & Special Collections Librarian responsible for procedure and related Digital Commons administration/oversight, as well as training Acquisitions Associate on the volume, issue and articles workflow, Acquisitions Associate responsible for article uploads.

- 1. Metadata Services & Special Collections Librarian will set up configuration in the appropriate journal Digital Commons site so that the path and location of volumes and issues exists before delivering documents and project information to Acquisitions Associate.
- 2. Metadata Services & Special Collections Librarian will then forward by email or provide on a flash drive to the Acquisitions Associate folders containing all documents (PDFs, WORD files, etc.) for individual issues and/or volumes for law review journals that need uploading to Digital Commons.
- 2. Acquisitions Associate will use Digital Commons "Submit Article" online form (test example is Georgia Law Review: https://digitalcommons.law.uga.edu/cgi/submit.cgi?context=glr) to upload each document from a journal issue, referencing the information in the Table of Contents for each issue to fill in:
- 1. author (will need to look up author to locate institutional email address)
- 2. title
- 3. publication date
- 4. article types
- 5. upload the document itself
- 4. After uploading each item, Metadata Services & Special Collections Librarian will receive an email from Digital Commons notifying a new

Interoperability through Metadata Exchange

The Open Archives Initiative Protocol for Metadata Harvesting (OAI-PMH) is a low-barrier mechanism for repository interoperability. *Data Providers* are repositories that expose structured metadata via OAI-PMH. *Service Providers* then make OAI-PMH service requests to harvest that metadata. OAI-PMH is a set of six verbs or services that are invoked within HTTP.

OAI-PMH Community Resources

- Ask questions, announce services, or make suggestions on the OAI-PMH Google group
- Data providers
 - Register as a data provider
 - Validation and registration
- Service providers
 - Register as a service provider
- OAI-PMH Tools Software and tools for data providers and service providers.

OAI-PMH Core Resources

- OAI-PMH Version 2.0 Specification
 Describes the six OAI-PMH verbs, the XML schema for responses to verbs, and the underlying data model
- Implementation Guidelines
 A supplement to the OAI-PMH Version 2.0
 Specification that includes guidelines for implementers and guidelines for specific application domains.
- Static Repository Specification
 Provides a simple approach for exposing relatively stable and small collections of metadata records through the OAI-PMH.

Dublin Core Elements in Digital Commons

Digital Commons supports the custom mapping of metadata fields to the Dublin Core elements listed below.
