Topics will cover the Structure, Institutions, and Law of the European Community within the European Union, and will address the process of completion of the Internal Market as well as the European Political Union and Economic and Monetary Union.

### HOW TO APPLY TO BECOME A PARTICIPANT IN THE BRUSSELS SEMINAR

#### REQUIREMENTS AND PROCEDURES

Thirty qualified student participants will be selected principally from among United States law students. Students who have finished one year of legal training can be admitted on the basis of previous work in areas of relevance to EC law. Some preference will be given to students who have completed two or more years of legal training.

#### COST OF PARTICIPATING IN THE SEMINAR

The Seminar will meet the costs of tuition (including study materials) and lodgings of student participants for the period of the Seminar. The participants will also be guests of the Seminar for the excursions to Bruges and Luxembourg, and at receptions, luncheons, and the Annual Dinner organized for the Seminar. Facilities for meals will be available at the Universities at a greatly reduced price. Each student must pay the registration fee of \$720\* upon arrival at the Seminar. Each participant will be expected to provide his or her own transportation from the United States to Brussels and return. The Seminar will not pay any expenses of spouses or others accompanying participants.
